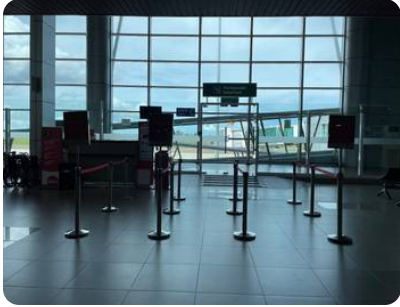

St. Michael's and All Angels Church, located at 51 Jalan Puncak in Sandakan, Sabah, Malaysia, is one of the oldest stone buildings in the region. Designed by New Zealander B.W. Mountfort, construction began in 1893 and was completed in 1906. The church's Gothic-style architecture features pointed arches and stained-glass windows. During World War II, it survived significant damage, making it one of the few stone buildings in Sabah. The church houses stained-glass windows donated by Australian Prisoners of War relatives to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the end of World War II. It is part of the Sandakan Heritage Trail, connecting several historical sites in the city.

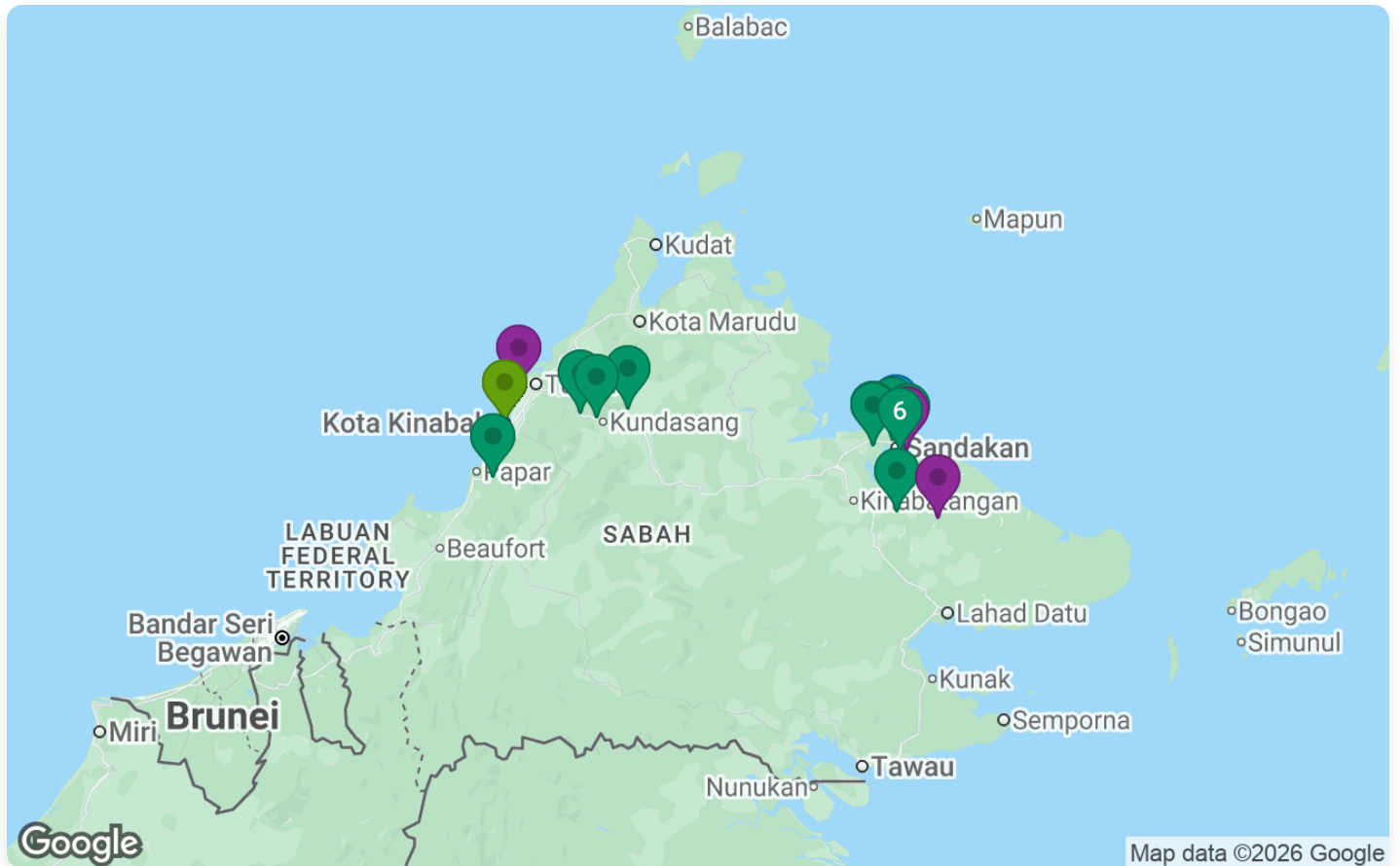
